January 7 - Introduction to the Class and The Temple: Your Spiritual Foundation

Principle: The temple prepares us spiritually and temporally for life's challenges and strengthens our faith and foundation in Christ.

Principle: Temples are sacred places where individuals can draw closer to God through sacred ordinances and covenants, which are essential for eternal life. The Tabernacle served as a model for obedience and consecration.
